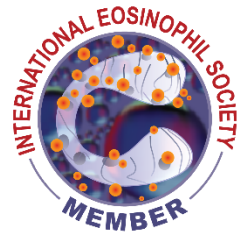


Dear IES Member:

APFED has sponsored and attended the IES Symposium for several years. The IES is also currently partnering with APFED to establish new ICD-10-CM codes in the United States for subsets of eosinophil-associated disease that currently do not have a code.
